Novice A Classes are open to dogs who have not completed any title for that particular element, who have not completed a comparable title with another organization, and whose handlers are neither scent Work judges, nor have worked as professional detection dog handlers.

Novice B classes are open to all dogs.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not

participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include crating, warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

The Handler's Briefing will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there is an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing.

A **warm-up area** will be available consisting of ONE marked container of each odor being tested at the trial and may also consist of blanks containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior their run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class.

Search Area Conditions. Searches may be indoors, on matted, carpeted, or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces. Trial will take place rain or shine

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area".

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search with handlers who have not run.

Crating space will be available on a limited basis and first come first serve. There is a parking lot to crate from your car. Bring your own shade and water.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

High in Trial

Only teams who participate in all elements offered and qualify in each, in the same level are eligible to win **High in Trial**. One High in Trial winner is chosen per level; there is no separate High in Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections.

The High in Trial is determined by adding the team’s faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the teams’ times across the elements will be summed and the faster-finishing team will win. If a Dalmatian team wins High in Trial, the team will earn a Rosette and a DCA Crested Queen Anne Charger Plate. Teams of other breeds winning High in Trial will earn a Rosette.

Special Performance Award – The Triathlete Challenge

If you and your dog are a multi-tasking team, set your sights on the SPECIALTY TRIATHLETE CHALLENGE, a special award given to EACH Dalmatian/handler team that earns a qualifying leg or passing score in three (3) or more performance/companion venues during the National Specialty. The eligible events are: Road Trial – CC, RD, RDX classes; Agility – all titling classes; Obedience – all titling classes; Rally – all titling classes; Barn Hunt – all titling classes; Scent Work all titling classes and FAST CATS – all titling classes. Only one score or performance in each venue will count towards this award, and the performance must be at the titling level, although the dog/handler team may already have earned the relevant title. If your dog can hock, heel, sniff, run, jump, just pick your venues and go for the challenge!

Wait List

The Dalmatian Club of America is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trials' closing date/time. A maximum of 25 entries will be placed on the waitlist for each Trial. All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to the closing date. No entries may be withdrawn with a refund after the closing date unless it is replaced by a wait listed entry. Only then, will a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry. Any wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial will receive a full refund.

Move ups

All pre-trial move-ups must be received by noon PDT, [July 2, 2020](#). The AKC requires move-ups to be in writing. Please send an email to spottedratpack@gmail.com to request your move-up. Trial to trial move-ups will be allowed provided the class is available and has not reached its limit, and the Trial Secretary receives your move-up form 15 minutes before the last class on trial 1.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The DCA and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The DCA reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the DCA or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fees minus a \$10 admin fee per trial. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN: At check-in you will receive your armband number. Once the time and location for check-in is determined all exhibitors will be notified by email.

- **The show-giving club, the Trial Secretary, the landowners or Asheville Crowne Plaza Resort,**

assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by the exhibitors, handlers or to any of their dogs or property.

- No dogs allowed in restrooms & no washing of animal food containers in restrooms. Bathing of dogs limited to bathing area.
 - **No videotaping or photography during the events for resale is permitted without Dalmatian Club of America, Inc. approval.**
 - **No baby strollers are allowed in the show site or adjacent hallways during show hours.**
 - The show giving club assumes no responsibility for the welfare of children & further expects exhibitors & spectators to keep their children under strict control.
 - **All AKC Rules and Regulations will be enforced by the Show Event Committee under AKC guidelines. Failure to comply with these rules will result in charges being brought before the Show Event Committee. Any event hearing, disciplinary action, rule violations, complaints, or charges will be resolved by the Dalmatian Club of America, Inc. National Specialty Event Committee. The Show Event Committee members are Toni Linstedt, Chair, Dr. Charles Garvin, Kevin O'Connell, Paula Olcott, SarahAnne Vanclieve, Meg Hennessey and Linda Stafford.**
 - **This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC entry form for this event.**
 - **Please be advised:** when an exhibitor/handler brings a dog to the podium for a win/placement photo they are establishing a de facto contract with the show photographer to purchase that photo.
 - CANADIAN EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT ENTRIES WITH CHECKS DRAWN ON U.S. ACCOUNTS OR WITH INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS IN U.S. FUNDS.
 - **EXHIBITORS & GUESTS: No one is permitted anywhere that is marked "Employees Only" and/or "No Admittance." No firearms allowed on the Crowne Plaza Resort - Asheville property. Violators will be reported to the AKC. No Smoking (including electronic cigarettes) in the Building. No push pins, nails or any type of things going into the walls. No adhesive other than Hotel approved tape should be used to affix a sign to a wall. Masking tape or command strips may be used.**
- UNLOADING/PARKING: No driving on grass areas.**

From North (Johnson City, TN): Travel South on Hwy 19/23 (also known as I-26 East); Merge onto I-240 West; Stay in the right lane as you merge, marked as an "Exit Only" for Exit 3-B (labeled Westgate and Resort Dr); Merge into the right lane as you pass the Westgate Shopping Center; The driveway is IMMEDIATELY as you round the curve to your right

From South (Asheville Regional Airport; Greenville/Spartanburg, SC; Columbia, SC): Travel West on I-26 Follow signs for I-240 to Asheville; Merge into the left lane and take exit 3A; This will merge you onto Patton Ave.; At the 2nd light make a right onto Regent Park Blvd (between Denny's and Pizza Hut); The road will bear right and the entrance will be immediately on the left (before entering Sam's Club parking lot); Follow the road past the golf course to the main entrance

From East (Hickory, Winston-Salem, Greensboro, Raleigh, NC): Travel West on I-40; Take exit 53-B onto I-240 West towards downtown Asheville; As you cross the "French Broad River Bridge" merge into the far right lane, marked as an "Exit Only" for Exit 3-B (labeled Westgate and Resort Dr); Merge into the right lane as you pass the Westgate Shopping Center; The driveway is IMMEDIATELY as you round the curve to your right

From West (Knoxville, TN): Travel East on I-40; Follow signs for I-240 East towards Asheville (left exit); Merge into the left lane and take exit 3A; This will merge you onto Patton Ave.; At the 2nd light make a right onto Regent Park Blvd (between Denny's and Pizza Hut); The road will bear right and the entrance will be immediately on the left (before entering Sam's Club parking lot); Follow the road past the golf course to the main entrance

The Show Event Committee will take disciplinary action against an exhibitor for any infringement of AKC Rules & Regulations regarding show sites & sportsmanship.

RESORT HOTEL POLICY: A one-time **\$50.00 non-refundable** pet fee for the hotel room(s). The guest will be responsible for any damages in excess of their deposit. Maximum of 4 dogs to a room. All dogs must be registered upon check-in, No Exceptions. No bathing of dogs in the hotel rooms whatsoever. No puppies under 4 months in the hotel rooms whatsoever. Dogs must be crated when owners are not in attendance. No exceptions will be made. Protect the carpeting by placing crates on plastic sheeting. Please do not affix any signs, photos or anything else to the hotel room doors or walls. Please use the door hanger provided when you are away from the room and your dog is inside the room. When walking in the hallways or public areas of the hotel your dog must be under control and on leash. Be very careful in the use of Flexi-leads. Do not allow your dog to freely approach anyone. Remember that others may not be dog people or, even if they are, may not want your dog to approach them. You are responsible for cleaning up after your own dogs. The Show Committee will set up designated dog exercise stations and signs indicating these areas. These are the **only** areas where dogs may be exercised. Excessively or senselessly barking dogs in or out of rooms must be quieted by the owner or they will be removed to another location by the Show Committee if the owner cannot be located. This will be enforced. No dogs are allowed in any area designated by the hotel or otherwise posted.

DCA HOTEL POLICY: Any exhibitor who allows his/her dogs to be loose & unattended in a room or to damage hotel property & does not immediately contact the hotel management to make proper restitution will be subject to a Show Event Committee action which could result in the loss of AKC privileges. If it is determined by the Committee hearing that rules are being neglected & destruction and/or misuse of property is taking place, the Committee has the authority to correct the problem or seek AKC suspension.

Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injuries death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by the negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees, agents, or any other person. I (we) agree that the determination of whether the injury is serious shall be made by the event veterinarian and is binding on me (us). HOWEVER, PRIOR TO ARBITRATION ALL APPLICABLE AKC BYLAWS, RULES, REGULATIONS, AND PROCEDURES MUST FIRST BE FOLLOWED AS SET FORTH IN THE AKC CHARTER AND BYLAWS, RULES, REGULATIONS, PUBLISHED POLICIES AND GUIDELINES.
